We've had a busy year to date. The "Destination Idaho" film by Karen Day, sponsored by BCHA was shown July 13 at the University Place Auditorium. Some 150 people witnessed the story of how Idaho has grown to become a destination and busy state as it explored the state's variety of landscapes.

The next Idaho Day Celebration will be held Friday, March 3, 2017, at the Colonial Theater in Idaho Falls, and is being sponsored by the Idaho National Laboratory on behalf of corporate funds from Battelle Energy Alliance. The State theme for this year is Idaho the Beautiful. Our county theme will be Idaho the Beautiful: Its Conduct and its Heroes. This program will highlight the positive way the State and Bonneville County and its people excel. This annual celebration happens because of legislation passed by Representative

Linden Bateman establishing March 4 as Idaho Day with celebrations throughout Idaho.

Another highlight of our Idaho Day celebration will be hearing from the winners of our student contests. BCHA is working hard to encourage young people to be interested in their heritage by sponsoring programs specifically for them, such as the student contests. Todd Brown, Dist. #91 Curriculum Coordinator and BCHA board member chairs the student contest program and announces the winners of the student contests and their cash prizes, with several of those winners giving their presentations during the Idaho Day program.

The BCHA Treasures Tour, chaired by board members Joe Stewart and David Nipper will be held from 10 am to 2 pm on Saturday, Sept. 10, 2016. It will begin at the Idaho Falls Library at 10 am until 11 am. Then attendees will go to the Sportsman Park where they will listen to four speakers: Joe Stewart, Linden Bateman, Davidjohn Stosich, and Susan Mardis from 11 am to 2 pm. We are encouraging attendees to bring a blanket, or chairs, and perhaps even their picnic lunch, for a relaxed family event. At 2 pm, attendees will be given a map listing places they can visit for a self-guided tour which will include the green belt from Pancheri Bridge to Freeman Park.

Join with us as we attempt to preserve the memories of our state and our county.
